



# BRIDGING PROGRAM to Certificate IV in Health Care (Ambulance)

## COURSE OUTLINE

### TARGET AUDIENCE:

This **Emergency Medical Technician** bridging program is designed for participants wishing to gain a Certificate IV in Health Care (Ambulance) equipping them with advanced medical skills, knowledge for patient care skills within an ambulance environment.

The course is applicable to those who have already completed the Certificate IV in Emergency Medical Response (National Code: 30714QLD or 10367NAT) and have maintained currency of that qualification within the last 12 months.

### ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:

Current Certificate IV in Emergency Medical Response (National Code: 30714QLD or 10367NAT) \*\*

\*\*Currency is defined as the qualification being not older than 12 months or the holder of that qualification having attended a PHERT (Pre-Hospital Emergency Resuscitation & Trauma) program within the last 12 months.
